

Deke Arndt

Deke Arndt has served as the Chief of the Climate Monitoring Branch of NOAA's National Climatic Data Center since 2009. The Branch is responsible for routine and special reporting of the status of the Earth's climate system, from large global phenomena like global temperature ("global warming"), to regional occurrences like drought and weather extremes. Mr. Arndt was one of the lead editors for 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 editions of The State of the Climate, an annual supplement to the Bulletin of the American Meteorological Society, featuring input and analysis from 350+ authors in nearly 50 countries. Before coming to NCDC, he spent 15 years at the Oklahoma Climatological Survey. Mr. Arndt holds a B.S. and M.S. in Meteorology from the University of Oklahoma. He is also a student in the University of Oklahoma's Adult & Higher Education Ph.D. program.
