



Stuart Weinstein

Stuart Weinstein is the Deputy Director of the Pacific Tsunami Warning Center (PTWC) in Ewa Beach, Hawaii, USA. He has held this position since 2005, and has been with the PTWC since 1998. He oversees the day-to-day operations of the warning center and conducts tsunami training with the International Tsunami Information Center based in Hawaii.

Stuart was born and raised in New York. He received his B.S. in Geophysics and Geology from Binghamton University (New York) in 1983 and an M.S. in Geological Sciences from Northwestern University (Illinois) in 1986. Stuart received his Ph.D. in 1991

from the Johns Hopkins University (Baltimore) for his dissertation on thermal convection in planetary mantles.

He continued in this area of research with a National Science Foundation Postdoctoral Fellow in Earth Sciences grant at the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor) in 1991 and at the University of Hawaii as the SOEST Young Investigator in 1993.

Yearning for his native homeland of NY Stuart moved back to NY in 1996 where he worked for Bloomberg L.P. in New York City writing software to analyze Mortgage Backed Securities.

Deciding he missed the year-round pleasant climate of Hawaii, Stuart moved back to Hawaii (by now he was well experienced in moving trans-continental distances) and has worked ever since at the PTWC.
